Needs division for best bloom. Bearded Iris Iris Every 1 or 2 years to control spread and maintain vigor. Spring Rhizome. Divisions need 2-3" of rhizome and 1 fan. trimmed to half-size. Spring or fall. Beebalm Monarda Every 3 years to control rampant growth. Spreading. Bellflower Campanula Every 2 to 3 years or as the plant becomes crowded. Spring or early fall. Spreading. Divisions need 1-3 eyes, or a wedge from a large plant. Lambs-ear Stachys byzantina Every 2 to 3 years. Spring or early fall. Spreading. Discard weak centers. Lily of the Valley Convallaria majalis Divide for plant increase as desired. Clumping. Can be divided as clumps or single "pips". Early spring. **Ornamental Grasses** Every 3 to 4 years. Fibrous. Very dense root system, may require an ax or saw to divide. Varied Spring for most grasses. Tuberous. Divisions need 3-5 well-developed buds. Rarely needs division, may wait 3 years before blooming. Plant peonies with the eyes no deeper than 1 inch below the surface. Peony, Herbaceous Paeonia September or October. Phlox Phlox paniculata Spreading. Every 3 to 4 years. Early spring or fall. Purple cone-flower Echinacea Every 4 years. Spring or fall. Spreading. Sedum Sedum 'Autumn Joy' For plant increase. Spring. Clumping divisions. Tickseed Coreopsis Every 1 or 2 years to maintain vigor. Spring or fall. Spreading. Discard weak center.
